**Marjie Christopher from Rio Cibolo Ranch,
to the February 8, 2007 meeting**



In addition to being a past president of the San Antonio Herb Society, **Marjie Christopher** is a Master Gardener, Master Naturalist, Member of the Audubon Society, the American Herb Society, and a Docent at the San Antonio Botanical Gardens. Her landscape is certified as a wildscape and wildlife habitat. Marjie has also authored two cookbooks, *A Little Bit of Texas Cooking* and *Texas Pecans: The Whole Story, Bits and Pieces*.

Marjie devotes much of her time to the community, sharing her knowledge of plants, landscape, and cooking to various groups such as schools, women's groups, and others. Since 1987, Marjie has owned and operated Rio Cibolo Ranch, a 130-acre working longhorn cattle ranch and pecan orchard, which was founded for the sole purpose of entertaining and catering to private group functions. The ranch amenities include Cibolo Orchard, Creekside Garden, and Lily Gardens. These gardens were developed with Marjie's expertise and include herbs, edible plants, and fruit trees. Her love of cooking led to the development of the Rio Cibolo Ranch "A Little Bit of Texas Cooking School," located on the banks of the Cibolo of which she is the School Director.



Marjie is acclaimed for her unique and fanciful herbal arrangements and crafts, and her program will serve as inspiration for us to explore the visual side of herbs. She will also give us a tip or two on utilizing pecans to enhance herbal cooking.

The program will begin at 7:00 (with refreshments served beginning at 6:30) at the **San Antonio Garden Center**, corner of Funston and N. New Braunfels. The meeting is free and open to the Public.
